Annotated Bibliography Grading Rubric

Reminder: Keep this rubric, along with the graded draft of this essay, for use later this semester.

- C (70-79): This bibliography contains five sources, with annotations of about 200 words apiece; each source is academically credible or cleared with the teacher beforehand; each annotation identifies what its source's format is and generally describes what it is about; each annotation establishes some relevance to the intended topic for the Research Essay; it keeps general commentary for "padding" the length of the annotations to a minimum; it may include stylistic issues or mechanical errors, but not to the point that the annotations are difficult to understand; and it follows all MLA guidelines for works cited format discussed in class with few major errors.
 - B (80-89): This bibliography also addresses assignment and requirement conditions thoughtfully and/or originally; it clearly explains why each source is unique in its support for the intended topic; each annotation's description of its source (what it is about) points out specific relevant features; any MLA errors are isolated and very minor; it addresses a readership that is appropriate to the purpose of the bibliography; and incidents of comma splice and sentence structure issues are isolated (if at all).
 - A (90-100): This essay also demonstrates at least one of the following attributes of superior writing and research: especially complex or original in thought; especially sophisticated in expression; excellent work explaining the uniqueness of sources; especially compelling in purpose or recognizable in voice; especially thorough; excellent MLA formatting; and relatively flawless mechanics.
